I purchased the car from Surrey Stags (Fernhurst, Surrey, UK) in 1995. I am the fifth owner and have now had the car for 18 years. It has 34,000 miles on the odometer and in my custodianship she has been to France twice, round Britain in 48hrs twice (1996 and 2000) with Club Triumph (27 mpg no less) and participated in the Norwich Union Classic and the Greenwood London to Brighton Car Run. I imported it when I emigrated to South Africa in 2000. I've been a bit reluctant to use her for long journeys in SA as after 12 years she is still not registered or licenced – but hopefully that is about to change after a spot in Radio 702!

The Triumph is only used as a weekend driver but I have been known to enjoy the odd drive to work when the Jeep is in for a service.
